



## **College Application Week: Help for Undocumented Students**

During the 2002 General Legislative Session, the Utah Legislature passed a law allowing undocumented students who meet certain requirements to pay resident tuition costs, which are less expensive than non-resident tuition costs (<u>Utah Code Ann. §53B-8-106</u>).

Below are instructions to help undocumented students apply to colleges during College Application Week. If you have questions about whether the law applies to you, please ask your school counselor.

College or University	Instructions for Social Security Number (SSN) or Driver License Number	Contact at College or University
Dixie State University	If a student has a work authorization number they can use that number for the SSN.  If the student does not have a SSN or work authorization they should enter 999999999 in the SSN field. Salt Lake Community College	SSN not required in order to continue with online application. Check the box, "I don't have one" next to the SSN section.  SLCC asks for a Utah Driver License number or a Utah State ID number on the admission application. Please note a Utah Driving Privilege Card is not a Utah Driver License (Limited term DL under DACA are considered a valid DL/State ID). Westminster College	Leave the SSN field blank, it's not required to enter anything in that field in order to complete the application.  On the "Personal Information" page in the "optional" section, the last question asks: "Are you a U.S. citizen?" Leave the answer to this question blank. The answer options are from a drop down menu with no option to enter text. "Undocumented" is NOT one of the options.
