







### Your College and Degree Options

Schools Where Offered	Program or Degree	Completion Time
Career Schools (technical or vocational)	Diploma or certificate	1-2 years
Community and Junior Colleges	Associate Degree	2 years
Four-year Colleges and Universities	Bachelor's Degree	4 years
	Graduate Degree	Bachelor's degree + Master's: 1-2 years Doctorate: 4 or more years
	Professional Degree	Bachelor's degree + 3 or more years

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#### Example:

The University of Utah is a four-year university and offers over 100 bachelor's degrees and more than 92 combined graduate, joint and professional degree programs in the arts, sciences, engineering, business, humanities, health sciences, social and behavioral sciences, law, medicine, dentistry, etc.

### Things to consider!

- About 500 4-year colleges across the country accept more than 75% of their applicants
- Fewer than 100 colleges in the U.S. have acceptance rates less than 25%
- A majority of schools look beyond just test scores (i.e., holistic admissions)
- Don't stress about rankings, make sure the school you choose fits your needs

### Research admissions requirements

- Open Admissions
  - Examples: Utah Valley University, Weber State University, Dixie State University, Salt Lake Community College, Snow College

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- Admissions Index
  - Examples: Utah State University, Southern Utah University
- Holistic Admissions
  - Examples: Westminster College, Brigham Young University, and the University of Utah

## Preparing for College Admissions

#### Example:

Holistic admissions at the University of Utah

#### Core courses

- 4 years of English
- 2 years of Math
- 3 years of Science
- 1 year of History
- 2 years of a Foreign language

#### Academic Preparation and Performance

- ACT/SAT scores
- GPA
- Challenging courses
- Grade trends

### **Personal Achievements and Characteristics**

- Extra-curricular activities (i.e., leadership, service, clubs, etc.)
- Student background/familial responsibilities
- Personal qualities





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
## **College Applications**

- Applications (i.e., common, universal, or school specific)
- Application fees
- Official high school transcript
- Official ACT or SAT Scores
  - ACT: actstudent.org
  - SAT: collegeboard.org
- Other materials:
  - Letters of recommendation
  - Essays
  - Auditions
  - Portfolios
- Interviews
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#### **Example:**

The University of Utah provides its own application and requires the following:

- ✓ \$45 application fee
- ✓ Official high school transcript
- ✓ Official ACT or SAT scores
- ✓ Essay (Honors College only)
- ✓ Key admissions dates:
  - November 1: Honors College
  - December 1: Priority admissions

Example:

The University of Utah automatically considers you for merit and diversity scholarships if you apply for admissions by December 1. They also offer need-based, departmental and athletic scholarships. http://financialaid.utah.edu/
