Who is the Army National Guard?

The US Department of Defense consists of three Departments. The Army, Navy, and Air Force. The Marines are organized into the Department of the Navy. The Coast Guard is a part of the Department of Homeland Security. These 5 branches of Service are comprised of a full time force known as "Active Duty" and a part time force referred to as "Reserves". The Army and Air Force have an additional part time force known as the National Guard. The National Guard differs from the Reserves in that they have a mission to the state in which they reside. Each State and 4 territories have their own Army and Air National Guard that serve the State and the Federal Government collectively.

Origins of the National Guard



The National Guard is the oldest U.S. Military organization dating back to 1636. Ordinary citizens banded together to for the Militia to fend off dangers from the Frontier.

The National Guard has served in every confrontation in U.S History.

The Army National Guard was

officially organized in 1894. However its predecessor the Nauvoo Legion dates back to 1849. The Nauvoo Legion was organized by the State of Illinois, staying in tact as the pioneers journeyed to Utah. During their Journey, it formed the Mormon Battalion, which became the Utah Militias and eventually the Utah National Guard.
